We continue to be overwhelmed by the generosity of God shown through the beautiful people in our Diocese of Yakima. Whether it is in the wonderful programs and work carried out through our grant recipients, or the monetary gifts that keep this work going, we are forever grateful.

As we reflect on the past year, we would like to extend our gratitude to the current and emeritus members of the Board of Trustees and Advisors and to all those who volunteer to support the Foundation. We are also extremely grateful for the support of all the faithful, especially Bishop Joseph Tyson and all our dedicated Priests, Religious, Deacons, and lay leaders. Applications for faith education funding and scholarships are now being accepted (see page 2). This year, the Foundation will distribute \$200,000 in funding through the Celebration of Faith, with an additional \$12,000 to be added to the Celebration of Faith Education Endowment, to help ensure future support for this powerful ministry. That is an increase of over \$27,000 in one year! We are always so grateful for donors who have established new endowments and those who have supported existing ones, helping the Foundation continue its vision of providing enduring support for Catholic education and the ministries of Central Washington. As of February 28, the Foundation has \$4,403,431 in endowed assets which in total allowed us to distribute \$366,664.18 in 2018.

As we further the mission of the Central Washington Catholic Foundation we encourage you to consider how best to support your parish or favorite organization, and the role that the Foundation can play in your giving plan. Our various giving options allow donors to direct their philanthropy to the causes they care about the most. The Champion of Catholic Education Awards honor and celebrate individuals for their outstanding efforts, contributions, and achievements on behalf of Catholic school and parish education.




