Fr. Perron Auve is the 2019 Champion of Catholic Education—Special Honoree and will be honored at the Celebration of Faith on October 12. Fr. Auve was nominated by the religious education staff of Holy Spirit Parish in Kennewick for his foresight in

providing the youth of the parish with faith education through Life Teen Youth Ministry and his continued efforts to partner with and support St. Joseph Catholic School in Kennewick.

Pastor of Holy Spirit since 2007, Fr. Auve was recently moved to Senior Priest status after taking a serious fall in May of this year. He remains in rehab and is in good spirits. He is looking forward to regaining his strength,



returning to reside at the parish, and joining us at the big event to celebrate and reminisce about his many years of service to faith education.

The oldest of three children, Fr. Auve was born on July 1, 1936 to Eugene and Alice Devaney Auve in Yakima, WA. He attended St. Paul Cathedral **School** with visions of one day being a truck driver, but instead entered

the seminary at the age of 14. He was ordained on May 19, 1962 by Bishop Joseph Dougherty at St. Paul's Cathedral Parish.

Fr. Auve's first assignment was to teach at Yakima Central Catholic High School, enabling him to watch his sister finish her senior year of high school. Fr. Auve was named Headmaster of Yakima Central High School in 1966 and Principal of Carroll High School in 1969. As many can attest, there was not a day that went by where he was not passionate about the work he was doing.



From 1975 until 2001, Fr. Auve served as Co-Pastor at Holy Family Parish, Chancellor of the Diocese, and Pastor at St. Andrew Parish. Christ called him back into education and for the next six years Fr. Auve was the Spiritual Director at Mount Angel Seminary in St. Benedict, Oregon.



Fr. Auve has been connected to numerous ministries over the years including People of Praise, Marriage Encounter, REACH, and the Charismatic Movement. Today, he is the Director for Clergy Continuing Education and is a member of Jesus Caritas Fraternity of Priests.

Fr. Auve has been a guiding light for Catholic education for over 50 years and it is fitting to honor him as a Champion of Catholic Education. Nominator, Life Teen Co-Youth Minister, and 2017 Champion of Catholic Education Russ Haffner says, "I love Fr. Auve's enthusiasm for working with our youth. He jumps at the chance to join our teens and share his knowledge and passion for our Catholic faith."
